### Weekly Updates from Departments:

#### **Hinesburg Community Police**

- *Citizen Dispute* - On Monday, May 19<sup>th</sup>, the Hinesburg Community Police received a report that there was a large disturbance or fight in progress with upwards of seven people involved in the Triple L Mobile Home Park. In addition to Hinesburg, officers from Shelburne, Williston, Richmond and the Vermont State Police responded. Upon arrival, it was determined that the fight only involved two individuals; however, there were multiple persons involved. A 27 year old male from Hinesburg was arrested for driving under the influence of alcohol, disorderly conduct and unlawful mischief. There were no weapons involved.
- *Vehicle Fire* - On Wednesday, May 21<sup>st</sup>, Hinesburg Police and Hinesburg Fire Department responded to Silver St. for a fully engulfed school bus fire. The driver was able to get all the students off the bus and there were no injuries. The bus was chartered from Mt. Abe en route to a track meet.
- *Criminally Suspended License* - On Saturday, May 24<sup>th</sup>, an officer made an enforcement stop on a vehicle for speeding. Upon identifying the driver, it was determined that his operator's license was criminally suspended. The 25 year old male from Hinesburg was placed under arrest, taken to the station for processing and cited into court.

## **Weekly Updates from Boards, Committees, and Commissions:**

### **Development Review Board**

#### DRB Upcoming Agenda:

- *Haystack Crossing/Blackrock Construction:* Subdivision Sketch Plan for an 84-acre undeveloped parcel owned by Haystack Crossing LLC (Bissonette Family), located on the west side of Rte. 116; partially located in the Village NW District & the Agricultural District. Proposed is a subdivision of 90+ lots, 225 dwelling units, 50,000+ sq. ft. of commercial space, open/green space. Review continued from 3/18. This application is continued from 3/18.
- *Hinesburg Center, LLC:* Site Plan Revision. The applicant is requesting site plan revision to show what has been approved to date as well as any proposed revisions to address site plan discrepancies noted in the Findings of Fact #2 and Conclusion #6 and to ensure that all discrepancies have been addressed so there is a definitive and accurate site plan approved and on record. This application is continued from 4/15.

### DRB Upcoming Applications:

The following applications are “in the pipeline” but are incomplete and unscheduled at this time:

- *Aubuchon Hardware:* Proposal to install a 500 gallon LP Gas transfer station at the existing outdoor “Garden Center” area of the Aubuchon Hardware site.
- *Anup/Dam:* Proposal to install six (6) pole mounted lights and two (2) bollard lights on either side of the intersection at North Road.

The following applications are scheduled for July 1<sup>st</sup>:

- *Allen:* Conditional use, expansion non-complying structure – Proposal to replace existing shed with a small 2-story barn style structure in the back yard of residence located at 847 Pond Brook Rd.
- *Carse:* Subdivision preliminary plat – 4-Lot Subdivision/Preliminary Plat Review. The applicant is seeking preliminary plat approval for a 4-lot subdivision on a 181-acre parcel. The property is located on the south and east side of the Charlotte Road and the east side of Baldwin Road in the Agricultural Zoning District. The applicant got sketch plan approval in December, 2013.
