Weekly Updates from Departments:

Hinesburg Community Police

- *Criminal Driving License Suspended* – On Friday, May 30th, an officer made an enforcement stop on a vehicle. The 22 year old male driver from Starksboro was determined to be driving with a criminally suspended operator’s license. The driver was arrested, taken to the station for processing and cited into court.
- *Driving While Intoxicated* – On Saturday, May 31st, an officer was called to Shelburne Falls Road for the report of a single vehicle crash. Upon arrival, the officer found that the vehicle had gone off the road and hit a telephone pole. The 23 year old male driver from Hinesburg was arrested for suspicion of DUI, processed and cited into court.
- *Click It Or Ticket* – On Sunday, June 1st, the Hinesburg Police Department completed a 14 day Governor’s Highway Safety seatbelt enforcement campaign. During the grant funded campaign, officers issued 17 seatbelt tickets and arrested 2 intoxicated drivers.

Weekly Updates from Boards, Committees, and Commissions:

Development Review Board

DRB Upcoming Agenda:

- *Among the Trees, LLC*: Conditional Use/Camp Conversion, Expansion of a Non-Complying Structure, Development on a Private Right-of-Way, Development in FEH area, Expansion of a Non-Complying Structure. Property Location: 213 Wood Run in Shoreline District. The applicant plans to deconstruct the existing structure and build a year-round residence.
- *Enos*: 3-lot Subdivision/Sketch Plan Review – Property located at the south termination of Enos Rd. in the Rural Residential 1 District. Proposal for a 3-lot subdivision with the existing house on one parcel, and two additional, developable parcels being created. The existing parcel is a total of 10.17 acres and the proposed subdivision would break that into Lot 1: 3.05 acres (with existing house), Lot 2: 3.15 acres and Lot 3: 3.9 acres.

DRB Upcoming Applications:

The following applications are “in the pipeline” but are incomplete and unscheduled at this time:

- *Laforce*: Transfer of Land to Adjoiner – The applicant wishes to transfer approximately 5.8 acres from a larger 21.9 acre lot to a 3.34 acre lot. Property located at 109 Lavigne Hill Rd. in the Rural Residential 1 Zoning District.
- *Blanck*: Conditional Use/Sign Review – The applicants are requesting Conditional Use approval and Sign Review for a service establishment to occupy Unit #6 at the Village Center Plaza located on Mechanicsville Rd. in the Village Zoning District. The potential tenant will be a salon offering services such as manicures, pedicures and massages.
- *Frost*: Conditional Use – The applicants are proposing adding a small business (a micro-brewery) as a second use of an existing building (Minuteman Press) located at 171 Commerce St., in the Commercial Zoning District.

- *CCTA Reappointment* – At their meeting on Wednesday, June 4th, the Selectboard voted to reappoint Karla Munson as a CCTA Commissioner representing Hinesburg for a three year term beginning July 1, 2014 through June 30, 2014.
- *Revised Zoning Fee Structure* – The Selectboard continued the discussion regarding the Revised Zoning Fee Structure from their May 19th meeting. The major change is to the site plan fee structure – i.e., adding a charge tied to the size of the project so that larger projects pay more to help offset increased review costs. The Board has asked for additional information to be presented at their June 19th meeting.
- *FY14-15 Water/Wastewater Budget* – The Selectboard approved the revised DRAFT of the FY14-15 Water/Wastewater budget, as presented, at their meeting on May 19th. You may view this information in the June 4th SB meeting packet at the following link:

- *Charlotte Road* – Green Mountain Pipeline Services was contracted to clean and perform a CCTV (video) inspection of the 450 ft. of concrete drain pipe running along the side of Charlotte Road, beginning at the intersection of Route 116. Based on the video inspection, it was determined that the upper section of pipe was in good shape and only the lower section from the catch basin near the Dameron's house, and on down, needs repair. The recommended options were to either completely replace that length of pipe or have it sleeved (lined). Due to the fact that each option was almost equivalent in price, and the fact that replacement would also involve portions of the sidewalk, the Board approved the lining option. This will prove to be a considerable cost savings to the Town versus replacing the entire length of pipe.

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
