Weekly Updates from Departments:

Hinesburg Community Police

- *DUI / Accident* - On Wednesday, June 4th, officers responded to a single vehicle accident on Vermont Route 116 near Rocky Mountain Ln. The 52 year old male driver was determined to be under the influence of alcohol. He was transported to that station for processing. Due to being uncooperative, he was lodged at the Chittenden County Correctional Center.
- *Criminally Suspended License* - On Friday, June 6th, an officer observed a male with a small child on a motorcycle in the Mountain View Mobile Home Park riding without a helmet. When the individual spotted the officer, he took off. The officer recognized the driver and did not pursue because of the child on the back. Through follow-up, the 25 year old male from Hinesburg (also arrested on the 24th) was arrested and cited into court.
- *Agency Assist* - On Tuesday, June 10th, Hinesburg PD was asked by the State Police to respond to Huntington and hold the scene of a domestic assault until they could respond. Richmond PD also responded and the scene was held without incident.
- *Vandalism* - Hinesburg PD responded to CVU for a report of vandalism to equipment belonging to a contractor working on the football field. The damage totaled approximately \$1200 dollars.
