That said, please do not sign up your daughter for a session that you cannot attend so that we don't have to turn folks away unnecessarily. Also, if you sign up your daughter for a date & then discover that she will not be able to attend, please let us know as soon as possible so that players on a wait list get a chance. Anyone who signs up after the slots are full will be put on a waiting list & will be notified if spots become available. <u>Catchers - Sign-up Instructions:</u> Choose a time slot for any of the dates listed below. Catchers will be paired with a pitcher based on their experience level. If your daughter is a pitcher as well as a catcher she may do both. If your daughter would like to try both, select a time slot for pitching and also a time slot for catching ensuring that you list which position the reservation is for. Catchers do not have to attend all sessions -- just sign-up for those that your daughter can attend.

### **Development Review Board**

*Upcoming application(s) for DRB Review:* 

Hinesburg Center LLC (Phase II) – Sketch Plan Review - Hinesburg Center Phase II is a planned expansion of the existing Hinesburg Center Phase I, a mixed-use development at Vermont Route 116 and Farmall Drive in the Village of Hinesburg. Hinesburg Center Phase II is bound by Patrick Brook and the associated stream buffer to the north, the Creekside neighborhood to the South, and Hinesburg Center Phase I to the east. The Project is bordered to the west by the growth boundary for the village area, although the Project parcel continues into the agricultural zone. Currently the parcel is maintained as an open hay field.

The proposed Hinesburg Center II design is a smart growth, mixed-use neighborhood, with a focus on walkability. The project contains varied densities and housing types, as well as a range of ground-floor retail or office spaces. Proposal includes: 18 single-family residential units, 13 single-family attached units, 43 multi-family units. The project includes 9,400 sq. ft. of commercial space divided among 3 buildings. *This application is scheduled for the December 16<sup>th</sup> DRB meeting*.
