Hinesburg Community Police

- Winter Storm This has been an interesting week for public safety in Hinesburg, not to mention our residents. The police department had 63 cases for the week, up from the usual 40. The fire department was self-dispatching and members were staying at the fire station. At times, the police were responding to multiple accidents and could not have done our job without the help of the fire department who could maintain a scene until we arrived. Thanks to all the volunteers.
- Citizen Dispute On Sunday, December 7th, officers responded to Sunset Mobile Home Park for a reported citizen dispute. Officers determined that an altercation occurred when a female arrived to pick up a child and another female refused to let the child go until the father came home. The child was taken and transported to the grandmother who had legal custody. No further involvement was necessary.
- Citizen Dispute On Sunday, December 14th, an officer responded to the Village Cemetery for a reported assault. Upon arrival, a female was folding up a pocket knife. Another male and female were walking down the road. These people knew each other and were not friends. None of these people were Hinesburg residents but arrived coincidently at the cemetery within minutes of each other to locate a "Geobox". Statements were taken and no one wanted to press charges.

• Softball Information 2014-15 - The Shelburne Little League Softball Committee will be holding free pitching clinics for softball players league ages 8 to 12 in January to give players a chance for extra pitching practice and one-on-one instruction prior to the start of the 2015 season. League age is defined as a players age as of December 31, 2014 -- i.e., if your daughter is 8 years old on January 1, 2015 then she is considered league age 8 no matter when her birthday falls in the year. Clinics are open to all skill levels. Please feel free to forward this notice to any other folks who might be interested!

<u>Location</u>: All clinics will be held at the Shelburne Town Gym @ 5420 Shelburne Road.

Not a pitcher, but love catching or want to try catching?

Not a problem! We also welcome catchers at these clinics. Catchers will be suited up & asked to warm up the pitchers and then catch for them as they pitch from the mound. See instructions for catcher sign-ups below for more information.

<u>Pitchers - Sign-up Instructions:</u> Choose a time slot for any of the dates listed below to reserve a slot for your daughter. Due to space limitations we can only have 8 pitchers attend each time slot so reservations will be made on a first come first served

basis. That said, please do not sign up your daughter for a session that you cannot attend so that we don't have to turn folks away unnecessarily. Also, if you sign up your daughter for a date & then discover that she will not be able to attend, please let us know as soon as possible so that players on a wait list get a chance. Anyone who signs up after the slots are full will be put on a waiting list & will be notified if spots become available. Please send your reservation request to Lisa O'Day @ odayvt@gmail.com to reserve a spot. Players do not have to attend all sessions -- just sign-up for those that your daughter can attend.

<u>Catchers - Sign-up Instructions:</u> Choose a time slot for any of the dates listed below. Catchers will be paired with a pitcher based on their experience level. If your daughter is a pitcher as well as a catcher she may do both. If your daughter would like to try both, select a time slot for pitching and also a time slot for catching ensuring that you list which position the reservation is for. Catchers do not have to attend all sessions -- just sign-up for those that your daughter can attend.

What happens if sessions fill up and my daughter doesn't get a slot? Additional pitching sessions will be available during the course of the season.
