### **Hinesburg Community Police**

- Suspicious On Tuesday, March 24th an officer responded to the Hollow Rd. area for a reported suspicious white van out of Starksboro. The vehicle was located and determined to be a contractor who went to the wrong residence. Excellent call by the Starksboro resident who called the State Police.
- Suspicious On Friday, March 27, a bank in Hinesburg notified the officer that the day before, a suspicious individual wearing a hoodie, mask and gloves entered the bank and immediately left when there was no teller visible. The surveillance video was reviewed and pictures sent out to local agencies. The description matched the individual caught for the Vergennes bank robbery.
