Weekly Updates from Departments:

Hinesburg Community Police

- *Citizen Dispute* – On Sunday May 17th, an officer responded to Anthony Rd. for a citizen dispute. The property owner asked a person to leave and the person refused. Upon police arrival, the person did leave the property with no further action necessary.
- *Family Fight* – On Monday, May 18th after midnight, an officer was called out to Vermont Route 116 in the village for a reported family fight. Upon talking to the complainant, it was determined to be more a noise complaint. The other parties were contacted and there was no family fight or domestic violence incident.
- *Burglary* – On Thursday, May 21st, an officer responded to a Richmond Rd. address for a reported burglary with witness information. A vehicle description was given and the officer had a BOL (Be on the Lookout) broadcast. A state trooper went to the registered owners Bolton address and observed the suspect vehicle and the female suspect. - *Summer Reading Program (All Ages)* - Another great summer of reading is in the forecast! The Carpenter-Carse Library joins libraries across the state as they launch the 2015 Summer Reading Program with the theme "Every Hero has a Story." In a cooperative effort, librarians nationwide contributed to the summer program guide, resulting in lots of high-quality reading program materials and ideas. Over the past

several months, Sara and Judy have been busy using these tools and their own imaginations to create tons of summer fun.
