### Weekly Updates from Departments:

#### Hinesburg Community Police

- *Driving Under the Influence of Alcohol* – On Saturday, June 20<sup>th</sup>, an officer was stopped on Charlotte Rd. when he observed a vehicle roll through the stop sign at Leavensworth Rd and then turn its headlights off. An enforcement stop was made and it was determined that the operator had been drinking and subsequently determined to be under the influence of alcohol. The 29 year old male operator from Warren was arrested and taken to the station for processing. He was then cited into court.
- *Injury Accident* – On Friday, June 26<sup>th</sup>, Hinesburg Police, Fire and First Response responded to an accident on Vermont Route 116 and the Hinesburg General Store involving a pickup truck and a mobile crane. The pickup was northbound and went to make a left turn into the store. The pickup failed to clear the southbound lane before being struck by the crane. Fire department had to extricate the driver from the vehicle and two patients were transported to UVM Medical Center.
- *Vandalism* - On Monday, June 29<sup>th</sup>, the Hinesburg Police responded to a reported vandalism that occurred over the weekend at NRG. Three vehicles were shot with BBs damaging windows and the side of one vehicle. Shortly after, a call was received from CVU with a same report of building windows that were shot with BBs. Approximately twenty windows were shot requiring replacement. A conservative estimate between both locations is approximately ten thousand dollars. Police are checking on a possible vehicle that was seen in the area and anyone with information is encouraged to call Hinesburg Police. See photos on page 2.

### **Water & Wastewater Department**

- *Water System Emergency Issue Resolved! – June 24, 2015* - We have found and fixed the mystery water loss. The acute shortage is over; it is safe to return to normal, responsible water usage. The issue was found to be a service line leak in the Thistle Hill neighborhood. The leak was going straight down into gravelly soils making detection nearly impossible.

This week we have been conducting our bi-annual hydrant flushing to keep the water lines clean. This may be causing short-term water discoloration, but makes for cleaner water in the long run.

Thank you for your conservation efforts over the past few weeks, and thank you for your assistance and patience throughout the entire process.


