Weekly Updates from Departments:

Hinesburg Community Police

- *License Plates* – Vermont Department of Motor Vehicles along with state and local law enforcement are undergoing a major public awareness program to correct issues with the displaying of vehicle license plates. Issue one is faded license plates where the green background is faded or fading to white making the reading of the plates difficult or completely impossible. DMV will replace the license plates for free except there is a twenty dollar charge for persons wanting the same registration number (except personalized and low number plates). The second issue are the registration year tabs that are improperly located, not in the lower right corner. The third issue is license plate frames that cover the word Vermont or Green Mountain need to be removed. Lastly, vehicles are required to have either a front license plate or a Vermont Strong plate. Contact the police department or the DMV website with any questions.
- *Theft* – On Tuesday, July 14th, a business in the south part of Hinesburg reported the theft of two chain saws and other items.
- *Fraud* – On Thursday, July 16th, an older male came to the office to report that he received a call from a woman claiming to be from the Social Security Office and stating that they owed him money. He subsequently gave her his Social Security number, banking information and bank PIN number. I hope everyone reading this knows where this is going and to never give out personal information. If the person is legitimate, they will know your information. If you are not sure, you can always get a call back number and call the police department for advice.

- *Special Election* - The Special Election for whether or not to repeal the amendments to the Stormwater Regulations will be held on July 28th. The polls will be open from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m. and are located at Town Hall. You can vote early anytime between now and the day before the election. There will be an informational meeting at Town Hall on Thursday, July 23rd at 7 p.m. The ballot question reads as follows:

Article I: Shall the changes to the Zoning and Subdivision Regulations, as approved on May 18th, 2015 by the Hinesburg Selectboard be repealed? A "Yes" vote is to support the repeal of the changes, while a "no" vote would be a vote in support of the changes.

- *Green Mountain Passports* - Seniors 62 and over are eligible for a lifetime pass to the State Parks for a onetime fee of \$2.00. This Green Mountain Passport is also now available to all current and former military service members as well. You can get the Passport at any time in the Town Clerk's Office.
- *Dog License* - Reminder: If you haven't registered your dog for 2015, please do so as soon as possible. The fee is now \$10.00 per dog. Please be sure to have a valid rabies certificate for your pet. Thanks!
