Hinesburg Community Police

Trails Committee

• Regular monthly meeting – Wednesday, Sept. 16, 2015 at 7 PM in lower level meeting room of Town Hall.

- Richmond Road Bicycle/Pedestrian Improvements Feasibility Study Kickoff Thursday, Sept. 17th at 2 PM. We will meet at the Town Office, and then walk the project area (about 1.5 hours; 3 miles; weather permitting) followed by a brief meeting at the Town Office. The study will assess options for bike/pedestrian improvements between North Road and CVU and associated costs. This is a pre-requisite for budgeting and grants to implement a bike/pedestrian solution.
- Scavenger Hunt in the Hinesburg Town Forest Starting Saturday, September 19th and running through Saturday September 26th, the Trails Committee and Town Forest Committee are offering a scavenger hunt in conjunction with Hinesburg Annual Fall Festival and the 100th anniversary of Vermont's municipal forest enabling legislation. The 1.5-mile scavenger hunt is geared for families with young children and will be laid out as a loop on the Maiden and International Trails. Passports (clue and answer sheets) and maps will be available at the Hayden Hill Road East and West trailheads and must be turned in at the town offices by 3 PM on Saturday, September 26th to be eligible for prizes generously donated by local businesses. Winners will be announced at the Stone Soup Supper that evening and on Front Porch Forum.
- StoryWalk in the LaPlatte Headwaters Town Forest Starting on September 23rd and running through September 26th, a StoryWalk will be displayed at the LaPlatte Headwaters Town Forest. The beautifully illustrated children's book, "Over in the Forest: Come and Take a Peek," by Marianne Berkes will be installed along the trail leading from the Gilman Road trailhead parking area, across the field, into the forest, and to the Hidden Meadow. Thanks go to the staff and volunteers at Annette's Preschool who selected and prepared this very appropriate book for display.
