Weekly Updates from Departments:

Hinesburg Community Police

- *National Prescription Drug Take Back Day* - On Saturday, Hinesburg Police took in four full cardboard boxes of medicine turned in by residents. According to news reports, 5,600 pounds total were turned in from Vermont.
- *Family Fight* - On Sunday, September 20th, an officer responded to Wile St. for a reported family fight. The male had a cut lip but refused to give a statement and the female walked off also refusing to discuss the incident.
- *Injury Accident* - On Monday, September 21st, Hinesburg Police, Fire and First Response and Shelburne Police responded to the intersection of Route 116 and Shelburne Falls Rd. for a reported two vehicle accident involving a big rig. The driver of the pickup received injuries and was transported to UVM Medical Center.
- *Theft* - On Friday, September 29th, the theft of a trailer from Gilman Rd. was reported. The theft occurred at approximately 11:00 a.m. while no one was home. A suspect vehicle is described as either a white, silver or grey extended cab pickup, possible with a black passenger side quarter panel.

- *Training*
 - *MCI Training* - Members attended a mass casualty incident (MCI) training last week in Charlotte where a former coach bus was used to simulate a disaster with multiple

vehicles as well as patients. Our team was assigned to assist an injured patient and needed to remove the roof to extricate her.

- *New EMS Protocols* - There are new EMS protocols that are going into effect as early as October 1, 2015.

All agencies must complete the transition of all of their members to the new protocols by December 31, 2015. We are targeting a 10/1/2015 go live date with the new protocols.
- *Back-boarding* - One major change is in regards to back-boarding - new science based data shows that back-boarding can do more harm than good and has for the most part been removed from our protocols at the state level.
Patients involved in motor vehicle crashes will be able to exit the car on their own if they are able to and assisted to a stretcher. If a patient does meet criteria for the Spinal Mobile Restriction protocol - a cervical collar will still be applied.
- *Transition Practicals* - In light of these new changes, our training for 9/30/2015 was completing the state mandated transition practicals. This training was followed by Carbon Monoxide (CO) emergency training.
