# Weekly Updates from Departments:

#### **Hinesburg Community Police**

Party Check - The Hinesburg Police will be initiating a new program called Party Check. This program will allow parents to call in to tell us that they will be out of town for the weekend and that their teenager(s) will be home. When we are provided this information, it does not mean knocking on the door but simply driving by the house to make sure that things are quiet.

When parents are out of town and a party takes place, one of two things are occurring. One, the teenager is having a party despite the parents not approving. The second which is happening more frequently, the teenager asks a few friends over and because of social media, dozens of unwanted guests show up. The second scenario puts the teenager in the awkward situation of either calling the police themselves or allowing an unwanted party to continue.

If an underage drinking party is found, enforcement action may be necessary but we have a number of choices available when working with responsible parents. Finally, this program ensures complete privacy for the parents

• Winter Parking Ban – A reminder that the Hinesburg Winter Parking Ban officially went into effect on November 1<sup>st</sup>, but due to the weather, we forgot. In the event that it snows before spring, this ordinance prohibits parking on the streets that interferes with snow removal. It is requested that residents not attempt to second guess the weather and if there is ANY possibility of snow, park off street. Vehicles in violation can be ticketed or more likely towed.

- Attempted Break-in On Tuesday, December 1<sup>st</sup>, an officer responded to a business on Mechanicsville Rd. for a possible attempted break-in. There appeared to be pry marks on the door and no entry was made.

- Hannaford Trial Concludes Testimony for the Environmental Court trial on the Hannaford supermarket project concluded last Wednesday (12/2). Attorneys for the various interested parties have into January to submit final arguments and responses. It should be fully in the judge's hands for deliberation after January 19.
- December Meeting Changes Both the Planning Commission and the DRB modified their schedules in December due to the holiday season. The PC meets on 12/9 as regularly scheduled but will not be meeting on 12/23. They have tentatively scheduled a replacement meeting for 12/16. The DRB met on 12/1, conducted a site visit for a 9-lot subdivision on Observatory Road on 12/5 (Saturday), but will not be meeting on 12/15. Regular meetings resume in January. DRB on the first and third Tuesdays of each month. PC on the second and fourth Wednesdays of each month.

#### **Town Administrator**

• Water Supply and Treatment Project Construction Start – Construction on the water supply and treatment project approved by voters in November 2014 begins Monday. The Selectboard awarded the contract to Brandon, VT-based Naylor and Breen Builders, Inc. Erosion control measures are first, followed by excavation for the building's foundation. The window for project completion is 210 days, meaning that the new wells should be pumping water into homes and businesses no later than the 4th of July. A more complete project update is in the works, and will be available on the Town's website (www.hinesburg.org).
