




hinesburg area recreation trails

fred johnson wildlife management area trails

Description:

Over a thousand acres of Vermont State forested land located in the town of Hinesburg. Elevations range from 500 – 1500 feet. There are miles of unmapped and unmarked foot trails. Driving Directions to the Southern Parcel:

From Hinesburg Town Hall:

- South on Route 116 for 3.7 miles;
- Turn left onto Hollow Road;
- Follow Hollow Road for 1.3 miles;
- The parking area for the Fred Johnson Wildlife area is on the right.

Driving Directions to the Northern Parcel:

From Hinesburg Town Hall:

- South on Route 116 for 2.2 miles;
- Turn left onto North Road;
- Turn Right onto Lincoln Hill Road
- Watch for a “parking area and log road” mentioned on the state WMA website.
- (Note: This parking area has not been researched and verified by the Hinesburg Trails Committee)

Trailhead:

The trailheads are located adjacent to the parking areas.

Notes:

These trails have yet to be mapped by the Trails Committee. Please note that these are very large parcels of forestland. It is very easy to become disoriented on these parcels and find yourself on private land.
