Select Board and Town Administrator,

The HTFC did not find a conflict between this nomination and the HTF Management Plan. However, the committee does have concerns about the unknown legal or regulatory ramifications which may impact future HTF management. During our discussion, it was unclear if [22 V.S.A. Chapter 14 - The Vermont Historic Preservation Act](#), would apply to the town forest. According to the website, the law applies to property listed in the State Register of Historic Places. Devin stated that there would not be any state or federal restrictions and that Hinesburg would continue to manage and control the HTF.
