Hinesburg Community Police

Development Review Board

New applications received

- *David & Gillian Trevithick* - Subdivision Review for development on transferred land and Conditional Use Review for expansion of an existing structure on a 0.49-acre property located at 146 Sunset Lane East in the Shoreline Zoning District. The applicants are proposing to rebuild their existing home and add a second story without expanding the building footprint.
- *Hinesburg Center Phase II* - Conditional Use Review for development in a flood hazard area on property owned by David Lyman north of the Creekside neighborhood and west of the existing Hinesburg Center Phase I development. The applicant is seeking renewal of an expired permit granted on December 17, 2013 to place fill in a flood hazard area.

Applications to be heard at the May 17, 2016 DRB Hearing

- *Nancy Jenkins, LLC* - Final Plat Review for a two-lot subdivision of a 10.1-acre property located at 249 Leavensworth Road in the Agricultural Zoning District. Lot 1 would be 2.21 acres and include the existing house. Lot 2 would be 7.83 acres and include a proposed house site, two existing barns, and other structures.
- *Stephanie Spencer* - Sketch Plan Review of a two-lot subdivision of a 21.4-acre parcel located on Turkey Lane in the Agricultural Zoning District. Lot 1 would be 18.4 acres and remain forested. Lot 2 would be approximately 3 acres and include a proposed house site accessed from Turkey Lane.
- *St. Jude's Catholic Church* - Site Plan Review for exterior lighting at the 1.87-acre property located at 10759 VT Route 116 in the Village Zoning District. The applicant proposes to add two additional lights for the parking lot.
- *Estate of Arlene O'Neil* - Preliminary and Final Plat Review for a three-lot subdivision of a 235-acre property located on the west side of Leavensworth Road and the south side of O'Neil Road in the Agricultural Zoning District. Lot 3 would be 6.75 acres and include a proposed house-site for a four-bedroom single family residence. Lot 4 would be 13.11 acres and include a proposed house-site for a four-bedroom single family residence. Lot 5 would be 215 acres and continue to be used for agricultural purposes. hearing continued from 5/3/16
