### Weekly Updates from Departments:

#### Hinesburg Community Police

- *Family Fight* – On Monday, May 9, an officer responded to a family fight on North Rd. at Triple L MHP. This was a verbal altercation only and no action was necessary.
- *Alleged Assault* – On Thursday, May 12 in the afternoon, officers responded to an address in the village for a reported assault. A couple living rent free in an apartment alleged that the person actually on the lease, paying the rent, entered the apartment and assaulted the male by hitting him in the stomach. Luckily the female held the alleged assault male back from retaliation and the attack was reported to 911.
- *Alleged Assault* – On Thursday, May 12 at near midnight, officers responded to an address in the village for a reported assault. A couple living rent free in an apartment alleged that the person actually on the lease paying the rent, had struck the female when she went up to the apartment to calmly see if they could work things out. Based on the pattern that was being established, the actual person paying rent was advised not to return to the apartment.
- *Driving Under the Influence of Alcohol* – On Saturday, May 14, an officer made an enforcement stop on a vehicle on North Rd. It was determined that the 53 year old male from Hinesburg was driving under the influence of alcohol. The operator was arrested and taken to the station for processing. He was cited and released to a family member.

#### Applications to be heard at the June 7, 2016 DRB Hearing


