Weekly Updates from Departments:

Hinesburg Community Police

- *Family Fight / Domestic Assault* - On Monday, May 30, an officer responded to the Triple L MHP area for a reported family fight. While responding, a second report of a possible gunshot was made. The officer came into contact with a male walking on the roadway and determined he was involved in the incident. The investigation determined that two brothers were involved in a fight and their mother was cut when she attempted to intervene. The 27 year old male from Hinesburg was subsequently arrested, taken to the station for processing and lodged at the Chittenden County Correctional Center.
- *Family Dispute* - On Wednesday, June 1, an officer was called out for a reported family dispute in Triple L MHP. The officer met with the complainant at another location and determined that the family dispute was only verbal. The officer went back to the residence and the other party had left. No further action was necessary.
- *Excessive Speed Arrest* - On Wednesday June 1, an officer was parked on Leavenworth Rd. facing west towards Baldwin Rd. A vehicle passed going eastbound and accelerated to seventy-seven miles per hour in the posted forty five mile per hour zone after passing the marked police cruiser. The officer made an enforcement stop in the village and explained the speed to the 21 year old male operator from Richmond. The operator complained that the officer could not have obtained a radar reading because of the direction the cruiser was pointed. The officer then explained that he was using a hand held radar and not the fixed mounted one inside the cruiser. The operator was arrested, taken to the station for processing and released on a citation to appear.

Planning & Zoning

- *Interim Bylaw Hearing* - The Selectboard will hold a public hearing on June 16 at 7pm to get feedback on proposed interim bylaws to temporarily pause most development in the municipal sewer service area (map available on the Town website). More information available on the Town website. This comes at the recommendation of the Planning Commission. The Planning Commission feels this temporary development moratorium

is necessary to provide the Town time to complete municipal water supply explorations, an ongoing wastewater treatment study, and study potential revisions to land use regulations in the village growth area.

- *Town Plan Review Continues* – The Planning Commission hopes to wrap up review of draft 1 of the new Town Plan at their June 8 meeting. Meetings every week for the last six weeks in an attempt to move this along. Based on the PC discussions, a second draft will be crafted and shared widely with the community ahead of at least one PC public hearing – likely later this summer.
- *Magee Hill Road Solar Array Proposal* – The Planning Commission spent a lot of time at their May 11 and May 25 meetings reviewing a large solar project proposed on Magee Hill Road. The PC approved a motion to send a letter to the developer (Encore Renewable Energy) and the VT Public Service Board with feedback. Pending review of the draft language, this letter should go out later this week. The PC intends to recognize the many positive aspects of the project and its design, while encouraging the developer to continue conversations with immediate neighbors regarding issues raised to date.
