### Weekly Updates from Departments:

#### Hinesburg Community Police

- *Suspicious* – On Sunday, June 5, at 1:30 a.m., an officer was called out for a report of flashlights that could be seen on the second floor of a building under construction in the village. The officer found two individuals upstairs that had been drinking and were not involved in either burglary or vandalism.
- *Family Fight / Domestic Assault* – On Monday, June 6, officers responded to Triple L MHP for a reported domestic. The investigation determined that an assault did occur and the victim's boyfriend, a 36 year old male from Hinesburg was arrested. He was taken to the station for processing and then lodged in the Chittenden County Correctional Center.

Session # 1 (June 22<sup>nd</sup>) The Noble Sport: Falconry (with Vermont Institute of Natural Sciences) Have you ever seen a hawk soar through the air, only to land on a person's fist? If you've ever wondered how this is possible, join VINS for a family-friendly adventure in falconry! We'll explore a sport that has fostered relationships between humans, animals, and the environment for 4,000 years. Learn how falconers train their birds of prey. Touch the equipment that keeps

falconers and birds safe while they're working together. You'll also meet three live raptors up close! *Limited to 50 participants (younger/older children welcome with an adult).*

Session # 2 (June 29<sup>th</sup>) Silly Yoga with Ashley Through the use of music, literature and yoga-style games, children will be introduced to the benefits of yoga while hopefully developing a life-long love of the practice.
