#### **Hinesburg Community Police**

- *Theft* – On Sunday, August 14<sup>th</sup>, an officer was notified of the theft of a power pole from Richmond Rd. and Pond Brook Rd. A track in the dirt was followed going up Magee Hill to Sherman Hollow and the pole was found off the road in Huntington. The pole was recovered by Vermont Electric Co-op. The investigation is ongoing with a suspect identified.
