Weekly Updates from Departments:

Hinesburg Community Police

- *Drug Take Back* – On Saturday, October 22, the semi-annual drug take back was held at Kinney Drugs. At the end of the event, we had three full boxes of medicine that will be properly disposed of by the DEA. Thanks to all who participated.
- *Family Fight* – On Thursday, October 13, officers responded to Hillview Ter. in Triple L MHP for a reported family fight. Both parties were interviewed and no further police action was taken.
- *Domestic Assault* – On Wednesday October 19, officers responded to Hillview Terrace in Triple L MHP for a domestic assault. The investigation determined that there was a physical assault and the 57 year old male from Hinesburg was arrested and transported to the station for processing. He was subsequently lodged at the Chittenden County Correctional Center.
- *Criminal Trespass* – On Thursday, October 20, the Hinesburg Police Chief, Sergeant and two officers, as well as the Vermont State Police, Shelburne Police, and Chittenden County Sheriff deputies were on scene when protesters left Geprags Park and marched up Shelburne Falls Rd. to occupy the Vermont Gas worksite across from the park. The only arrests made were when six people refused to move from in front of the VT Gas employee's personal vehicles when the employees attempted to leave.
- *Driving Under the Influence of Alcohol* - On Thursday, October 20, officers responded to a vehicle off the road on Silver St. at Lewis Creek. The vehicle was unoccupied and the operator located at his residence. It was determined that the 43 year old male from Hinesburg was under the influence of alcohol. He was arrested, taken to the station for processing and released on a citation.

- *Voting* - Early voting has begun. The ballots are here and voters are welcome to come in to vote at any time we are open between now and Election Day, which is November 8th. Voting early helps to alleviate congestion at the polling place and is simply a convenient way to insure that you don't forget or have some unforeseen circumstance that prevents you from casting your ballot. If, for example, you came in to vote on Election Day and weren't on the checklist, you might not be able to cast your vote in Hinesburg. The easiest way to register to vote is through the new on-line voter system on the Vermont Secretary of State's website. Just go to www.olvr.sec.state.vt.us and check your status and change your registration to your current town of residence if needed. On another note, we really appreciate your consideration by not writing in names for races where there is not an actual write-in campaign happening. It is, of course, your right to write in names, but it creates a lot of work and a much later night

for the volunteers at the polling place when we need to look through every ballot and tabulate the names of people who are written in. Thanks for your consideration!

Development Review Board

New applications received

- *No new applications were received this past week.*

Applications to be heard at the November 1, 2016 DRB Hearing

- Hinesburg Center, LLC/David Lyman (Phase II of the Hinesburg Center Project): Subdivision Preliminary Plat Review. The applicants have proposed 25+ lots, 69 dwelling units, 13,400 sq. ft. of commercial space, and open/green space on a 46-acre undeveloped property located west of Kinney Drugs and north of Farmall Drive in the Village Zoning District, however they are considering seeking approval for only a partial build-out at this time. Hearing continued from 10/6/15, 2/2/16, and 5/3/16. Sketch Plan Approval was granted on April 27, 2015.
- Hinesburg Center, LLC/David Lyman (Phase II of the Hinesburg Center Project): Conditional Use Review for Development in a Flood Hazard Area. The applicants are proposing to place approximately 55,000 cubic yard of fill on the site, of which 17,000 cubic yards will be in the Patrick Brook and LaPlatte River flood hazard area. The remaining 38,000 cubic yards will be outside of the flood hazard area. Hearing continued from July 19, 2016. A Conditional Use Permit was granted on December 17, 2013 but has since expired.
