Weekly Updates from Departments:

Hinesburg Community Police

- *Drug Take Back* – On Saturday, April 29th, the Hinesburg Community Police will be holding a drug take back at Kinney Drugs at 10218 Vermont Route 116 in Hinesburg. The hours will be from 10 am to 2 pm and all prescription and non-prescription drugs are accepted.
- *Attempted Fraud* – On Tuesday, April 18, a resident contacted an officer to report that a person with a Milton phone number called her to advise that she had one a million dollars and that she needed to send \$10,000 dollars to receive the money. She stated that she would not send any money and the caller said he would come by her residence. Two officers remained in the area during the agreed time and no one showed up.
- *Reported Assault* – On Sunday, April 23, officers responded to a residence on Vermont Route 116 north of the village for a reported fight between two females. It was determined that one female's foot was stepped on when the other female attempted to go into the residence. It was mediated that return of property would be by a third party and no other law enforcement involvement was necessary.

New applications received

- *Stephanie Spencer*: Final Plat Review of a two-lot subdivision of an approximately 21.3-acre property located on the east side of Turkey Lane in the Agricultural Zoning District. Lot 1 would be 3.05 acres and include a proposed house and garage accessed from Turkey Lane. Lot 2 would be 18.25 acres and remain forested.

Applications to be heard at the May 2, 2017 DRB Hearing

- *David & Kathleen Newton*:
 - Conditional Use Review for a cottage industry on a 0.57-acre property located at 9303 VT Rte. 116 (east side of VT Rte.116 south of the intersection with Place Road) in the Rural Residential 1 Zoning District. The applicants are proposing to expand the existing building by adding a one-story 12' x 55' shed to create additional interior workspace. The business had previously been categorized as a contractor's yard. *Hearing continued from 4/4/17.*

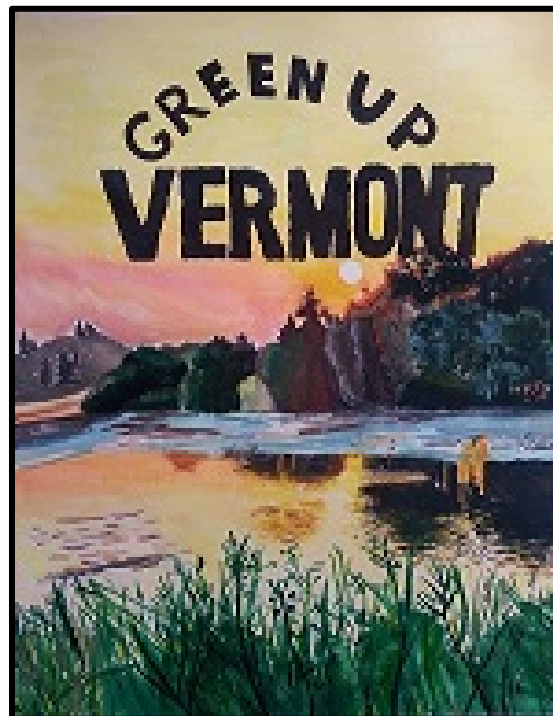
